ARTIST CORNER

Atlanta area Latino artists, Maria Lucia Sarmiento, Victoria Gilly, Waldo Vinces and Jaime Valero recently painted Perimeter Mall's "Tropicowl" and Home Depot's "Handy Cow" live at Perimeter Mall. These artists are from Colombia, Venezuela and Spain respectively. "Tropicowl" is an expression of Latino cultural heritage and its influences, which have become an important part of American society. The cow will also broadcast music with tropical rhythms created by local Atlanta band, Raices. Thanks to the Lanza Group, the artists were featured in several Spanish language publications in Atlanta. In addition, San Francisco native Adine Le has been spending her time designing "Mooterial Cow", which she calls a combination of Madonna's "Material Girl" music video and the Reese Witherspoon movie "Legally Blonde." The "On the Bricks Cow" could quickly become one of the biggest collectors items of the CowParade invasion. This cow will travel to each concert during the On the Bricks Concert Series to be autographed by the performers. Upon completion of the concert series, the cow will be varnished and auctioned off alongside the other CowParade artwork.



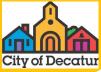
